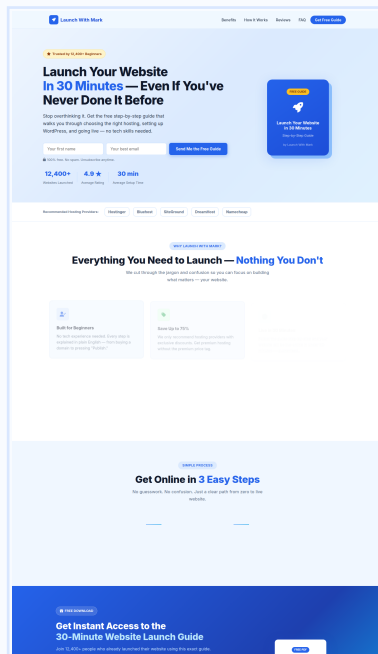

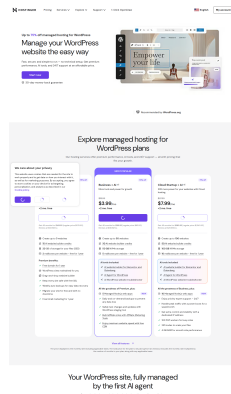

## Step 3 Install WordPress

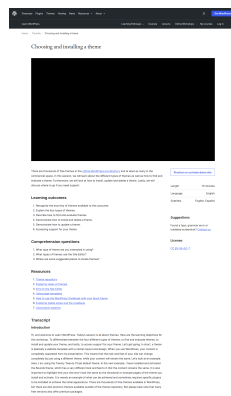
WordPress is the platform that helps you build pages, update content, and manage your site without coding. Most beginner hosts let you install it in one click.

# Section 3: 7 Costly Beginner Mistakes to Avoid

These are the common mistakes that waste the most time, money, and momentum.

## 1. Choosing the wrong hosting plan

Starting with something too advanced creates confusion. A safer beginner path is [the hosting option I recommend](#).

## 2. Overpaying

You usually do not need every add-on on day one. Start simple and upgrade later if needed.

## 3. Not using WordPress

WordPress is flexible, beginner-friendly, and backed by a huge library of tutorials and themes.

## 4. Skipping SSL and security

Basic security matters right away. SSL helps your website look more trustworthy and protects visitors.

## 5. Trying to make it perfect before launching

Perfection slows beginners down. Publish a clear first version and improve it later.

## 6. Installing too many plugins

Too many plugins can make your site messy or slow. Start with only the essentials.

## 7. Writing pages with no clear purpose

Every page should help visitors understand who you are and what they should do next.

## Section 4: Bonus - Simple Website Blueprint

If you are unsure what pages to create first, use this simple structure.

|                 |  |
|-----------------|--|
| Home            | A short welcome, what you offer, and the main action you want visitors to take.            |
| About           | A simple introduction to you, your business, or your story.                                |
| Contact         | A way for people to reach you, such as a form, email, or booking link.                     |
| Blog (optional) | Useful later if you want to share updates, tips, or articles, but not required on day one. |
